She is responsible for visiting classes and observing the training and teaching taking place and for giving encouragement and shepherding to the teachers. She is involved in her church through discipling, teaching, and writing training materials.



Rick Hill works for the Presbyterian Church in Ireland in the area of discipleship development, majoring on the delivery of disciple-making training and the development of discipleship resources. Prior to this, Rick comes from a background in youth ministry with both Scripture Union and in a local church. He now serves as an Elder in Carnmoney Church while also being involved in a fresh church plant from that church in the city centre of Belfast. Emanuel Tundrea grew up in communist Romania, but the faith of his parents had a huge impact on him. Emanuel currently leads the ELF Foundational Disciple-Making Network. In 2001, he joined the staff at the Emanuel University of Oradea, where he is serving now. He completed his PhD in software engineering in conjunction with the University of Nice, France, and then he earned his MA in Pastoral Theology at Oradea. Both his involvement in academia and in the church aim to evangelise and mature disciples for Christ.
